



## INNOVATIVE TEACHING/TRAINING GRANT APPLICATION

## Six \$1,000 Grants will be awarded

Deadline - January 10, 2025

<u>ELIGIBILITY</u> All IB teachers from <u>authorized</u> Texas IB <u>member</u> schools (TIBS) are eligible to apply.

<u>PURPOSE</u> The Innovative Teaching/Training Grants provide an opportunity to recognize and reward outstanding IB teachers and programs in TIBS member schools and provide enriching academic experiences for students by funding creative, innovative academic projects and/or IB teacher training.

<u>GRANTS CRITERIA</u> The grant award committee of Texas IB schools will judge the applications on the following criteria:

- 1. purpose/need (1 10 pts.)
- 2. potential to improve student achievement and/or to enhance instructional skills. (1-10 pts)
- 3. number of students who will benefit (1–10 pts)
- 4. timetable and cost effectiveness/realistic budget (1-10 pts)

(Maximum of 40 points)

<u>GRANT AMOUNTS</u> Each grant amount is \$1,000. Six grants will be awarded. <u>TIMELINE</u> The deadline for submitting grant proposals is 5:00pm on January 10, 2025. All proposals should be submitted in <u>electronic form only</u> to the following email address:

Winners will be notified via e-mail no later than April 25, 2025.

<u>EVALUATION</u> Grantees must provide a written report to Texas IB Schools within thirty (30) days of the conclusion of their project. This report is to include a financial statement and narrative describing the project and how it benefited students and the teacher or certificate of IB training attendance.
